Dear Trustees and Temple family,

Over 200 will be at Temple for tomorrow night's 2nd night Seder made possible by WRJ, close to 50 more will be downtown thanks to the Temple 20-30s affinity group, and the convergence of Pesach and Easter on Sunday will highlight Temple Israel and the common road to freedom blacks and Jews have traveled at the 42nd Annual Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. April 4th Commemoration at the National Civil Rights Museum at 3 p.m.
