



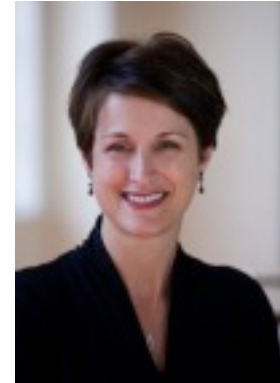
Temple Tuesdays Literature Series:

Leigh Mansberg discusses the story of the woman whose cancer cells were cultured without her permission in 1951. Author Rebecca Skloot was, until recently, a professor at the University of Memphis.
