Award winning teacher and director E. Frank Bluestein will introduce us to some of the greatest Jewish songwriters and their vast and diverse contributions to some of Broadway's finest musicals. E. Frank Bluestein is the 1996-1997 Disney and McDonald's National Performing Arts Teacher of the Year and the 1994 Tennessee Teacher of the Year. In October of 1998, USA Today named Bluestein as one of the top 40 teachers in the United States.



At Germantown High School in Germantown, Tennessee, Bluestein serves as the chairman of the school's Fine Arts Department. He is the founder and director of the school's theatre, the Poplar Pike Playhouse, and also serves as executive producer for the school's three million dollar Emmy award winning educational television facility.

Bluestein is a past winner of the American Theatre Association's John C. Barner Award, and has served as an arts advisory panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts, the College Board Arts Advisory Committee, the Council of Chief State School Officers, and the Tennessee Arts Commission.

He spent several years as a director of shows at Opryland, USA, and most recently wrote and directed the national touring production of *Beale Street Saturday Night* starring blues legend Joyce Cobb. Bluestein is a frequent speaker and writer on arts related issues.
